The castle was founded by William De Warenne in 1066.

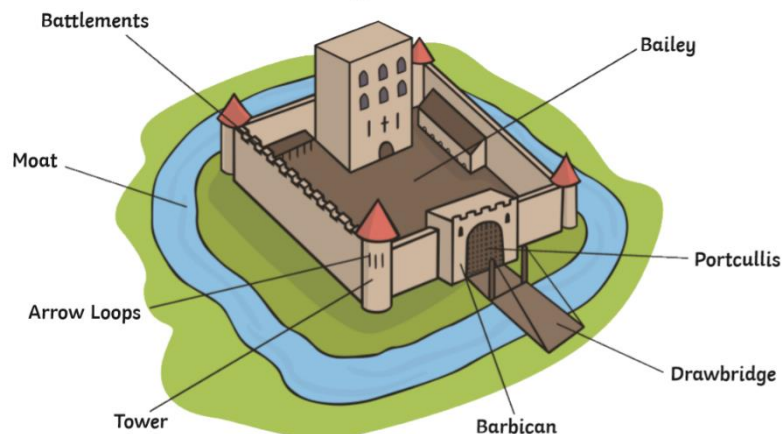
The castle was built using stone.
