Effective Use of PE and Sports Premium at Coleridge Primary School 2020-21

(Numbers provided by January 2019 Census- £16000 plus £10 per pupil Y1-6
184 pupils x £10= £1840 + £16,000= £17840)

Overall Aim

“Every child will enjoy increased participation in sporting activities and develop a healthier lifestyle”

Coleridge Primary School will use its Sports Premium Grant to improve PE and Sports participation across the school and will promote a healthy lifestyle for all children.

Coleridge will offer an increasing number of children the opportunity to compete for our school in a rising number of Sporting events and improve the opportunity to develop the excellence of talented pupils. To this end, we now have discrete responsibility for sport, separate to PE.

The 4 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

The main aspects that we will develop are:

The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

- All pupils have PE lessons every week and active break times and lunchtimes. Activities beyond the MUGA and outdoor equipment are starting to be provided to facilitate further activity. School provides swimming for Year 4 and 5 termly and a variety of sport after school clubs.

The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement

- School has leaders for PE, Sport and Curriculum Enhancement to raise the profile

Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

- The school will use the Sports Premium Grant to raise the standard of teaching and learning, by upskilling teachers in PE through a Sport & Education Package from Live and Learn, which will underpin progression and continuity in children’s sporting skills and address pupils’ additional needs and mental health. See Live and Learn report.

Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

- School provides swimming for Year 4 and 5 termly and a variety of sporting after-school clubs.
- We are always looking at providing a broader balance of activities.
- This will be extended to offer additional after-school clubs to develop self-control and discipline.

Increased participation in competitive sport and sporting activities

- Increasing participation in sporting activities and local competition and encourage excellence in a wider range of sports. Increasing the opportunities to take part in inter-school competition will also raise levels of motivation and enthusiasm. The Sports Funding will fund the costs of participation in competitions, but more importantly the ever increasing costs of transport to different venues.

Details of Grant 2020/21- Current Allocation- £17,840

Nature of Support

- 1 and a half days per week of teacher CPD (37 weeks x £37 per hour) £10,952
- Support costs of additional transport to allow additional participation in sporting activity or new events. Estimated costs (10 x £75) £750
- Additional after-school clubs to School Sport & Education Package Estimated costs £3,000 (Gymnastics, Street Dancing etc.)
- Resources to provide broader experience of sports and activities, including additional swimming provision targeted to pupils not meeting swimming requirements of the National curriculum, resources and visitors etc £3200

Observations of impact and outcomes at this point and access to funding by numbers of children- over 100 representing Coleridge at different Rotherham and South Yorkshire events.

Impact of PE and Sports Premium £17840 2019-20- (Sept-March Impact of Covid-19):

To provide teachers with CPD to improve assessment/teaching/monitoring of P.E. across school

- All staff have observed lessons throughout the year.
- All teacher's confidence levels in teaching has increased.
- All teachers now leading elements of PE sessions.
- Lesson observations show teaching of PE is excellent. See TOAP.
- Data shows increased percentage of children working at EXS.
- **To offer support to staff re: P.E planning & assessment.**
- Teachers have a clearer understanding of the planning process.
- Staffs understanding and knowledge of PE skills.
- **Live & Learn sports coaches to plan, organise and lead annual Cross-MAT Sports Days for EYFS, KS1 & KS2.**
- Pupil questionnaire shows that 100% of children love PE sessions
- All sporting competitions on L&L calendar attended.
- **Children to access a range of After School Sports Clubs.**
- A wide variety of sporting clubs are available.
- All clubs have 100% attendance rate
- 97% of parents said school after school provision is good.
- **Other Outcomes**
- Increased participation, motivation and enthusiasm in sporting activities from Sept to March
- Children and parents becoming more aware of healthy lifestyles
- Gold Sports mark retained
